

SUBJECT: Grants Program Directorate Information Bulletin 350 - The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (FFATA) or Transparency Act - P.L.109-282, as amended by section 6202(a) of P.L. 110-252

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1. The FFATA requires the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to provide full disclosure to the public of Federal spending through a single searchable database that identifies all entities or organizations receiving Federal funds beginning in fiscal year (FY) 2007. FFATA of 2006 has since been amended by section 6202(a) of Government Funding Transparency Act of 2008 (P.L. 110-252) to require specific financial disclosure under certain Federal awards for highly compensated officials, specifically the name and total compensation of the five most highly compensated individuals. As defined by the OMB, all **new** Federal awards of \$25,000 or more as of October 1, 2010, are subject to FFATA reporting requirements.
 2. The State of Delaware, as the grantee, will be responsible for entering all eligible awards into the FFATA Sub-Award Reporting System, including awards to sub-grantees. Sub-grantees will be required to provide, upon request, necessary information about the award to the State of Delaware for reporting purposes. This information that may be requested includes location of the entity and primary location of performance including city, state, and Congressional district, and the Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) DUNS Number of the entity, and its parent if applicable;
 3. Additionally, sub-grantees will be required to provide the total compensation and names of top five executives if 80% or more of annual gross revenues are from Federal awards (contracts, sub-contracts and Federal financial assistance), and \$25,000,000 or more in annual gross revenues from Federal awards; and compensation information is not already available through reporting to the Securities and Exchange Commission.
