COURSE DESCRIPTION	The Incident Command System (ICS) is the national standard to manage emergency incidents and critical events and is a key component of NIMS. This system of incident management is applicable at all jurisdictional levels and across functional disciplines. This course is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event using the Incident Command System focusing on the management of single resources. The course will satisfy state training requirements for incident responders and will fulfill the prerequisite for attendance in higher level ICS courses (ICS 300/400). As part of NIMS compliance requirements, Delaware has implemented the requirement that all personnel that are likely to assume a supervisory or management level role in ICS must attend an ICS 200 level course.			
COURSE OBJECTIVES	 Describe how the NIMS Management Characteristics relate to IC and UC Describe the delegation of authority process, implementing authorities, management by objectives, and preparedness plans and objectives. Identify ICS organizational components, the Command Staff and General Staff Describe different types of briefings and meetings. Explain flexibility within the standard ICS organizational structure. Explain transfer of command briefings and procedures. Use ICS to manage an incident or event. 			
PREREQUISITES	All participants are required to provide proof of completion for each prerequisite by sending copies of completion certificates to <u>training.dema@delaware.gov</u> to be eligible to attend the course -IS-700 Introduction to NIMS -IS-100 Introduction to Incident Command System Recommended: IS 800 National Response Framework			
TARGET AUDIENCE	The primary audience is response personnel, <u>regardless of discipline</u> , at the supervisory level. Senior line personnel who may be required to fill a supervisor/leader role within the Incident Command System during larger incidents must complete this training for NIMS compliance. These groups include first responders, state/local government and agencies, emergency management personnel, private industry, volunteer organizations, and support agencies.
